## THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

## BY-LAW NO. 40-84

BEING A BY-LAW TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE MAIN STREET FROM FRASER STREET TO FERGUSON STREET AND BETWEEN FERGUSON STREET AND WYLD STREET.

WHEREAS the Council deems a farmers' market on Main Street would serve a useful social, recreational and community purpose, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the request of the Downtown Improvement Area Board of Management it is deemed expedient to temporarily close a portion of Main Street pursuant to the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302, Sec. 208, subsection 44.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- That the portion of Main Street from Fraser Street to Ferguson Street and between Ferguson Street and Wyld Street in the City of North Bay be and the same is hereby closed to vehicular traffic from 7:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon each Saturday from 14 July, 1984 to and including 29 September, 1984 for the purpose of holding a farmers' market.
- 2. That the Director of Planning and Works is hereby authorized to supply barricades upon which adequate warning devices shall be exposed and in good working order continuously while Main Street is so closed to the Board of the Downtown Improvement Area, and the Board shall ensure that such barricades are erected at each end of the portions of Main Street while Main Street is so closed.
- 3. That prior to 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon each Saturday, the Downtown Improvement Area Board of Management will attend to the restoration of the said portion of Main Street to its condition prior to the above closure.

4. The Corporation shall provide and keep in repair a reasonable, temporary alternative route for traffic and for all property owners who cannot obtain access to their property by reason of such closing.

READ A FIRST TIME IN OPEN COUNCIL THE 24th DAY OF APRIL, 1984.

READ A SECOND TIME IN OPEN COUNCIL THE 7th DAY OF MAY, 1984.

READ A THIRD TIME IN OPEN COUNCIL AND ENACTED AND PASSED THIS 7th DAY OF MAY, 1984.
