

BY-LAW NUMBER 392.

BEING A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE SALARIES TO BE PAID TO POLICEMEN IN THE TOWN OF NORTH BAY.

WHEREAS there is no By-law in existence in the Town of North Bay at the present time, providing for the salaries to be paid members of the Police Force,

BE IT ENACTED AND IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ENACTED, by the Municipal Council of the Town of North Bay, as follows:-

1. The salary of the chief of Police shall be Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per year, payable at the rate of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month.
2. The Policemen in the employ of the Town will receive Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per month for the first year they are on the Police Force, and Eighty-Five Dollars (\$85.00) per month after the expiration of the first year.
3. All salaries at the above-mentioned rate will commence to run from the first day of June, 1914.
4. That members of the Force be supplied with one ^{serge} jacket and trousers for summer wear; one serge jacket and trousers for winter wear; one overcoat for winter wear; one rubber coat; one helmet for spring and fall, and one wedge for winter, and that same be paid for by the Corporation, said uniforms to remain the property of the Town and in the event of any member of the force leaving, said clothing to be returned to the chief Constable in good condition before the then current month's salary be paid over.
5. After one year's service, members of the force will be entitled to ten days' holidays with pay, once each year.
6. All former By-laws and resolutions with reference to Policemen's salaries are hereby repealed.
