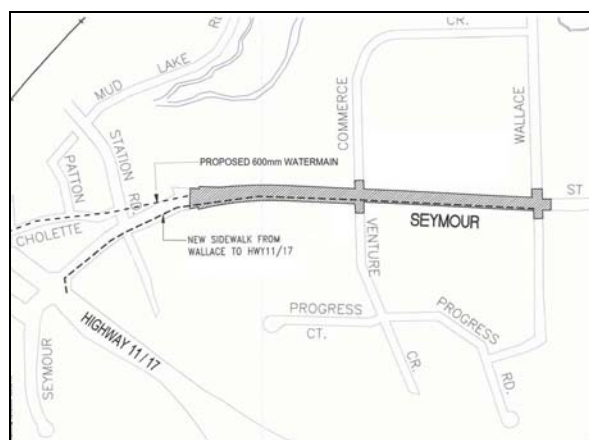

**SCHEDULE C
NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION**

**CITY OF NORTH BAY
CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT
SEYMOUR STREET ROAD IMPROVEMENTS**

The City of North Bay has completed a Class Environmental Assessment for improvements to Seymour Street from Station Road to Wallace Road (see map). To accommodate continuous growth and address the need for additional transportation capacity in the area, a number of alternatives have been examined as part of the study including the pavement rehabilitation, increasing the left turn capacity of Seymour Street, and improvements of the Seymour Street / Commerce Crescent / Venture Crescent intersection.

The City of North Bay has planned this project under **Schedule C** of the **Municipal Class Environmental Assessment**. The Environmental Study Report has been completed and by this Notice is being placed in the public record for review. Subject to comments received as a result of this Notice and following receipt of necessary approvals, the City of North Bay intends to proceed with construction of this project within their infrastructure capital works plan. The estimate of probable construction cost for the preferred option is \$6,915,790.

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with the City of North Bay, a person may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environmental assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below by February 4, 2013. A copy of the request must also be sent to the City Clerk. If no request is received by February 4, 2013, the project may proceed to construction as outlined in the Environmental Study Report.
