THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

BY-LAW NO. 66-93

BEING A BY-LAW TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE A PORTION OF OAK STREET BETWEEN MEMORIAL DRIVE AND ALGONQUIN AVENUE, OAK STREET BETWEEN ALGONQUIN AVENUE AND MAIN STREET AND THE OVERPASS BETWEEN JUDGE AVENUE AND OAK STREET.

WHEREAS pursuant to the request of the Canadian National Institute of the Blind, it is deemed expedient to temporary close a portion of Oak Street and Main Street, pursuant to the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M-45, Section 207, Subsection 44.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the portion of Oak Street between Memorial Drive and Algonquin Avenue in the City of North Bay be and the same is hereby closed from 8:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Sunday, May 16, 1993, for the purpose of the CNIB Roller-Blade-A-Thon.
- 2. That the right-hand half of Oak Street between Algonquin Avenue and Main Street is hereby closed from 8:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Sunday, May 16, 1993, for the purpose of the CNIB Roller-Blade-A-Thon.
- 3. The the south bound right-hand curb lane of Main Street and the overpass between Judge Avenue and Oak Street is hereby closed from 8:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon on Sunday, May 16, 1993, for the purpose of the CNIB Roller-Blade-A-Thon.
- 4. That the Director of Transportation and Works is hereby authorized to have barricades and warning devices erected to carry out the said closure.
- 5. That prior to 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon on the 16th day of May, 1993, the Director of Transportation and Works, will attend to the restoration of the said portions of Oak Street and Main Street to its condition prior to the above closure.
