

BY-LAW NO. 1419

BEING A BY-LAW to fix the Polling Places and appoint Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the holding of Municipal Elections for the year 1945, in the Municipality of North Bay.

WHEREAS it is necessary to pass a By-Law fixing Polling Places and appointing Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the purpose of taking the vote of the Electors, to select a Mayor and Ten (10) Aldermen (to be elected by General Vote) to transact the Municipal Affairs of the City and for the selection of Three Public School Trustees and one Hydro Commissioner to be elected by General Vote.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:-

2. THAT Polling Place No. 2 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in W. Sanitary's Store, 384 Main Street West and Jas. F. Devine is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. J. Hamilton, Poll Clerk.
3. THAT Polling Place No. 3 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in E. Turner's Residence, 268 Main Street West and P. H. Torrance is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Miss Nellie Delaney, Poll Clerk.
4. THAT Polling Place No. 4 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in C. J. O'Grady's Residence, 169 Klock Avenue, and C. J. O'Grady, is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. Genevieve Roche, Poll Clerk.

8. THAT Polling Place No. 8 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in N. Chaput's Residence, 171 First Avenue West, and H. T. Relph is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. Eva Anderson, Poll Clerk.
9. THAT Polling Place No. 9 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets and H. Freeman is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. H. S. Locke, Poll Clerk.
10. THAT Polling Place No. 10 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and W. Cassin is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. J. J. Ryan, Poll Clerk.
11. THAT Polling Place No. 11 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the Canadian Legion Rooms', Ferguson Street and J. Vanier hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. G. Nicoll, Poll Clerk.
12. THAT Polling Place No. 12 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the W. Jennings' Residence, 18 Fourth Avenue West, and Geo. Stewart is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. J. McColgan, Poll Clerk.

15. THAT Polling Place No. 15 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in E. C. Bebee's Residence, 399 Cassells Street and E. C. Bebee is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. Doris Larivee, Poll Clerk.

16. THAT Polling Place No. 16 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Miss N. D. Buchanan's Residence, 74 Sherbrooke Street, and Stafford Francis is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Homer Day, Poll Clerk.

17. THAT Polling Place No. 17 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Peter Mantha's Residence, 235 Worthington Street East, and Art Caley is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. H. R. Miller, Poll Clerk.

18. THAT Polling Place No. 18 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in F. Elston's Residence, 175 McIntyre Street East, and E. Willis is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. E. Lafontaine, Poll Clerk.

19. THAT Polling Place No. 19 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in D. Mantha's Residence, 344 Main Street East and C. Johnson is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Samuel W. Webber, Poll Clerk.

20. THAT Polling Place No. 20 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in J. E. Corbeil's Residence, 307 Worthington Street East, and Mrs. E. Setchell is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. J. W. Bonnell, Poll Clerk.

21. THAT Polling Place No. 21 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in C. A. Jarvis' Residence, 245 Regina Street and Samuel G. Webber is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. Walter Kennedy, Poll Clerk.

22. THAT Polling Place No. 22 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in J. Perrin's Residence, 305 Regina Street and J. Mellis is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. W. E. Ross, Poll Clerk.

23. THAT the Railway Employees, Express Messengers, Truck Drivers, Bus Drivers, and Commercial Travellers, Advance Polling Place for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and Frank Elston is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Fred Cade, Poll Clerk.

24. THAT the City Clerk shall attend the Council Chamber at the hour of Twelve O'Clock Noon on the 6th day of December A. D. 1944 for the final summing up of the Number of votes for the Mayor and Alderman School Trustees and Hydro Commissioner.
