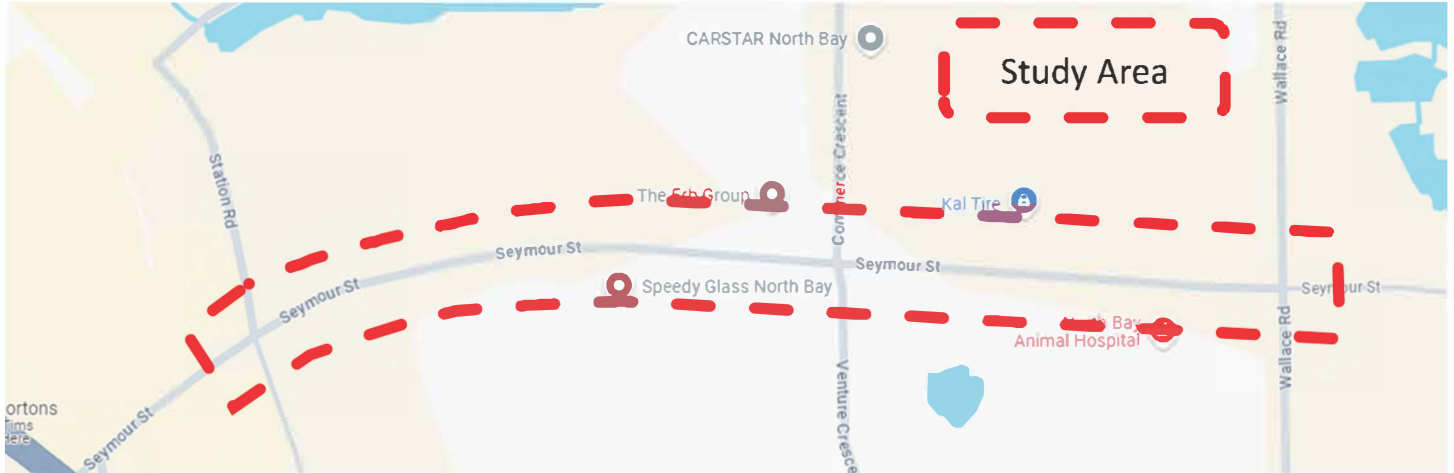




Seymour Street Road Improvements Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study Notice of Addendum

The City of North Bay completed a Schedule C, Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for improvements to Seymour Street from Station Road to Wallace Road. The improvements are necessary to facilitate and support future growth within the study area and ensure that future transportation and infrastructure demands can be accommodated. The Class EA concluded with the filing of an Environmental Study Report in January 2013.



Due to the lapse in time between filing the Environmental Study Report and implementing the project (i.e., construction), it is necessary to review the planning and design process and the current environmental setting to ensure that the project and the mitigation measures originally recommended in the Environmental Study Report are still valid given the current planning context.

An Addendum has now been completed to the Environmental Study Report that contains details of this review. By this notice, the Addendum, along with the original Environmental Study Report, are being placed on public record for a 30-day review period and comment in adherence to the approved Class EA process for Schedule C projects per the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (February 2024). The Addendum has been filed and will be available from December 10, 2024, to January 10, 2025.

Interested parties are encouraged to review the Environmental Study Report Addendum and provide comments by January 10, 2024. Comments should be directed to the Project Team below. The original ESR and Addendum are available for review on the City website noted below.

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In addition, a request to the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order imposing additional conditions or requiring an individual environmental assessment may be made only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights.
