

BY-LAW NO. 1374

BEING A BY-LAW to fix the Polling Places and appoint Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the holding of Municipal Elections for the year 1943, in the Municipality of North Bay.

WHEREAS it is necessary to pass a By-Law fixing Polling Places and appointing Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks for the purpose of taking the vote of the Electors, to select a Mayor and Ten (10) Alderman (to be elected by General Vote) to transact the Municipal Affairs of the City and for the selection of Three Public School Trustees and One Hydro Commissioner to be elected by General Vote.

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:--

2. THAT Polling Place No. 2 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in W. Santary's Store, 384 Main Street West and Arthur Stanley Waite, is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Howard Graham Poll Clerk.
3. THAT Polling Place No. 3 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in W. F. Roynon's Residence, 256 Main Street West and P. H. Torrance is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. Mary Sutherland, Poll Clerk.
4. THAT Polling Place No. 4 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in B. Lentz's Residence, 17 Front Street and T. Bale is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mr. Lionel Cusson, Poll Clerk.

9. THAT Polling Place No. 9 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and H. Freeman is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. H. S. Locke, Poll Clerk.
10. THAT Polling Place No. 10 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and W. Cassidy is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and J. R. Bailey, Poll Clerk.
11. THAT Polling Place No. 11 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets, and J. Vanier is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and J. P. Jones, Poll Clerk.
12. THAT Polling Place No. 12 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in S. Riopelle's Residence, 18 Fourth Avenue West and Joseph Cosgrove is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. John McColgan, Poll Clerk.

15. THAT Polling Place No. 15 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. E. C. Bebee's Residence, 399 Cassells Street, and E. C. Bebee is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. Doris Larivee, Poll Clerk.

16. THAT Polling Place No. 16 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Miss M. D. Buchanan's Residence, 74 Sherbrooke Street and G. M. Brady is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. A. Groulx, Poll Clerk.

17. THAT Polling Place No. 17 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. Peter Mantha's Residence, 235 Worthington Street East and J. White is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. H. R. Miller, Poll Clerk

18. THAT Polling Place No. 18 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Mr. Frank Elston's Residence, 175 McIntyre Street East and E. B. Willis is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and Mrs. E. Lafontaine, Poll Clerk.

19. THAT Polling Place No. 19 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in C. Washburn's Residence, 336 Main St. East and Edgar Elston is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. Paul Vizena, Poll Clerk.

20. THAT Polling Place No. 20 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in Wm. Baril's Residence, 65 John Street, and P. G. Corbett is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and Mrs. E. Setchell, Poll Clerk.

21. THAT Polling Place No. 21 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in C. A. Jarvis' Residence, 245 Regina Street and Mrs. A. Vanreeth is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and G. H. Greer, Poll Clerk.

22. THAT Polling Place No. 22 for the purpose of the said Election shall be in J. Perrin's Residence, 305 Regina Street and J. Mellis is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer, and J. Perrin, Poll Clerk.

23. THAT The Railway Employees Express Messengers, Truck Drivers, Bus Drivers, and Commercial Travellers, Advance Polling Place for the purpose of the said Election shall be in the City Hall, McIntyre and Ferguson Streets and Frank Elston is hereby appointed Deputy Returning Officer and F. Cade, Poll Clerk.

24. THAT the City Clerk shall attend the Council Chamber at the hour of Twelve O'Clock Noon on the 9th. day of December A.D.1942 for the final summing up of the number of votes for the Mayor and Aldermen, School Trustees and Hydro Commissioner.
