THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

BY-LAW NO. 35-96

BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE USE OF PUBLIC PARKS WITHIN THE CITY OF NORTH BAY AND TO REPEAL BY-LAW NO. 106-81, AS AMENDED

WHEREAS Section 207(58) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M-45, provides that by-laws may be passed for maintaining, operating and managing parks, recreational areas and playgrounds within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS Section 207(42) of the Municipal Act provides that a by-law may be passed prohibiting the use of vehicles in the parks in the City of North Bay.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

PART I - DEFINITIONS:

In this by-law

- (a) "City" means The Corporation of the City of North Bay
- (b) "Council" means the municipal council of the City
- (c) "Director" means the Director of Tourism, Parks and Recreation or such other city employee designated by the Director
- (d) "Employee" means an employee of the Tourism, Parks and Recreation Department or such other city employee designated by the Director
- (e) "Event Organizer" means a group or individual who is primarily responsible for the organization of an event
- (f) "Fire" means the combustion of substances with oxygen and air so as to give out bright light and heat, but does not include the use only of coals for the purpose of cooking food above such coals where the coals are enclosed by the non-combustible structure designed for such purpose
- (g) "Fireworks" means any incendiary device save and except sparklers
- (h) "Parks" means any parcel or tract of land, including buildings, structures and facilities owned by the City and set aside and hereby dedicated by Schedule "A" of this by-law for the purposes of a public park and any land, building, structure or facility under the ownership, lease or control of the City and used by the public for park or recreational purposes
- (i) "Municipal Beach" means waterfront land including buildings, structures and facilities owned by the City and set aside and hereby dedicated by Schedule "B" of this by-law for the purpose of public park
- (j) "Designated Area" means an area defined or identified for a specific use which may include posted conditions
- (k) "Organized Sport or Activity" means a sport, game or activity pre-planned by a group or organization whether or not formally constituted and whether or not the players or members wear uniforms

- (1) "Permit" means any written authorization of Council, Director or an employee of the City where such authority has been delegated
- (m) "Post or Posted Area" means the erection or presence of permissive, regulatory, restrictive, warning or prohibitive signs and "posted area" means an area where the signs are erected
- (n) "Motor Vehicle" includes a motor vehicle as defined under the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, as may be amended from time to time, and any snowmobile, go-cart, bike, mini bike, all-terrain vehicle or similar vehicle propelled or driven by internal combustion, bicycle, carriage, wagon, sleigh or other vehicle or conveyance of every description, whatever the mode of power, but excludes wheelchair or similar device (powered or otherwise) used by an individual due to a disability, baby carriage, cart, child's wagon, child's stroller, child's sleigh or other conveyance of like nature
- (o) "Non-Motorized Vehicle/Muscular Powered Vehicle" includes vehicles such as in-line skates, skateboards or other conveyance of like nature
- (p) "Enforcement Officer" includes any police officer, provincial offences officer or employee of the municipality whose duties include the enforcement of this by-law
- (q) "Heavy Machinery and Equipment" includes commercial vehicles, farm equipment, road and building machines and husbandry
- (r) "Animals" include dog, cat and domesticated wildlike such as skunks or ferrets
- (s) "Special Event" means a pre-planned activity or series of activities meant to attract people for an intended purpose with a program or schedule of events

PART II - CONDUCT

POSTED OR RESTRICTED AREA RESTRICTIONS

2. No person, while in any park, shall enter areas where authorized signs have been posted to prohibit or restrict admission.

CONDUCT

- 3. No person, while in any park, shall
 - (a) act in any riotous, violent or threatening conduct or use profane or abusive language;
 - (b) remain in the waterfront/beach/park between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.;
 - (c) cast, throw, or in any way propel any object in such a manner as may injure or cause injury or damage to any person or property; or
 - (d) create a nuisance by loitering, accosting, frightening, annoying or otherwise disturbing other persons.

INJURY AND DAMAGE

- 4. No person shall, while in any park, unless authorized by the Director
 - (a) climb any building, structure or equipment, unless it is equipment designed for climbing;
 - (b) break, damage, deface, move or remove the whole or part of any flowers, plant material, tree or other vegetation or any building, structure, equipment or other property of the municipality;
 - (c) unless authorized by permit, climb, move or remove the whole or part of rocks, boulders, rock faces or remove any soil, sand, sod or wood;
 - (d) in any manner, disturb ground which is under repair, prepared for planting, has been recently seeded or sodded or is in an area posted as such.

WASTE/POLLUTION

- 5. No person shall, while in any park:
 - (a) litter, dump or dispose of tree trimmings, leaves, grass cuttings or any other garbage, except that which is generated through the normal use of the park and shall only deposit same in the receptacles provided for that purpose;
 - (b) unless authorized by permit, dump or deposit snow, fill, soil, building or construction materials;
 - (c) dump or drain onto any soil or into the water of any pond, lake, stream, fountain, pool or watercourse of any kind any material, toxic or hazardous substance which may result in environmental harm;
 - (d) release balloons.
- 6. During special events, event organizers shall provide recycling containers and deliver recycling materials to the City's recycling centre.

PROTECTION OF WILDLIFE

- 7. No person shall, while in a park
 - (a) kill, attempt to kill, maim, injure, trap or disturb any animal, bird, waterfowl, fish or other wildlife unless approved by the Director,
 - (b) touch, injure or remove any nest or egg unless approved and governed by the Director.

ENCROACHMENT

- 8. Unless authorized by permit, no person shall
 - (a) encroach upon or take possession of any park or part thereof;
 - (b) construct or install any fence or structure in any part or part thereof;
 - (c) dump or store materials in any park.

ALCOHOL MANAGEMENT

9. No person shall, while in any park, consume, serve or sell alcohol unless authorized by a permit from the Tourism, Parks and Recreation Department and with the approval of the Liquor License Board of Ontario.

PART III - PARK USE

CAMPFIRES AND BARBECUES

- 10. No person shall, while in the park
 - (a) light, build or stoke an open fire or bonfire unless authorized by permit;
 - (b) use charcoal unless authorized by permit;
 - (c) leave an area used for a campfire or barbecue without rehabilitating the area back to its original state.

ORGANIZED GATHERING OR PICNIC

- 11. No person shall, while in any park
 - (a) unless authorized by permit, hold a picnic, organized gathering or event for more than twenty-five persons;
 - (b) interfere with a picnic, organized gathering or event authorized by permit unless invited; or
 - (c) serve, consume or sell alcoholic beverages unless with permits by the Liquor License Board of Ontario and the Tourism, Parks and Recreation Department permit.

AMPLIFIERS/LOUD SPEAKERS

12. No person shall, while in any park during a special event, operate loud speakers or amplifying equipment unless authorized by permit.

CAMPING AND LODGING

13. No person shall, while in any park, dwell, camp or lodge unless authorized by permit.

TENTS/STRUCTURES

- 14. (a) No person shall place, install or erect any temporary or permanent tent or structure in any park unless authorized by permit.
 - (b) All tent/structures authorized by permit shall meet the requirement for structures as outlined in the Building Code and subject to a building permit for erection.

BATHING, SWIMMING AND SUNBATHING

- 15. No person shall, in any park
 - (a) fail to obey the instructions of any municipal lifeguard or other authorized person;
 - (b) utilize any municipal beach without adequate swimwear or adequate clothing;
 - (c) unless authorized by permit, use municipal beaches between 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.;
 - (d) fail to abide by the posted rules and regulations of a municipal beach.

USE OF WASH/CHANGE ROOMS

- No person shall enter any portion of any washroom, or changeroom in any park set apart for the opposite sex.
- No person shall use any washroom or changeroom for any purpose other than its intended use.

PART IV - GAMES, SPORTS AND ORGANIZED ACTIVITIES

ORGANIZED SPORTS AND ACTIVITIES

- 18. No person shall, while in any park
 - (a) arrange or engage in any organized sport or activity unless authorized by permit;
 - (b) interfere with an organized sport, activity or its participants authorized by permit.

ACTIVITIES

- 19. No person shall, while in any park
 - (a) cast, throw, or in any way propel any object in such a manner as may injure or cause injury or damage to any person or property;
 - (b) obstruct, inconvenience or endanger other users of the park while participating in games, sports or organized activities;
 - (c) utilize a park area for games, sports and activities where signs have been erected to prohibit user.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- 20. No person shall make use of any park for a "special event"
 - (a) unless authorized by permit;
 - (b) unless all appropriate regulating departments have been notified (see Schedule D) and guidelines are complied with.
- 21. Any person requesting exclusive use of a park must do so through Council and obtain authorization for this use.

22. Temporary road closure may only be permitted through Council by way of a resolution or co-ordinated with City Police on the event site if public safety is a factor.

FIREWORKS

- 23. While in a park no person shall
 - (a) ignite, discharge or set off any firecrackers, rockets or other fireworks unless authorized by permit;
 - (b) all firework displays shall comply with the safety standards for firework displays as determined by the Director and by way of regulations governing the ignition of fireworks
- 24. The Director has the authority to revoke or change a permit based on conditions that may be deemed hazardous or unsafe without prior notice.

PART V - VEHICLES

PARKING

25. DISABLED PARKING: No person shall park or leave a vehicle in a designated disabled parking area unless the vehicle has the required permit from the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario and the appropriate permit is displayed on or in the vehicle.

SPECIAL PERMITS may be issued by special event organizers, approved by the Director, to allow access to special parking areas by individuals temporarily disabled who are not permitted through the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario but still require access to parking in close proximity to the event.

GENERAL PUBLIC PARKING: No person shall park or leave a vehicle in a park except in a designated area for parking.

MOTORIZED RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

26. No person shall ride, drive, park or be in possession or control of a motorized recreational vehicle in any park except in a designated area or under authorization of a permit.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES, PASSENGER VEHICLES, TRUCKS, COMMERCIAL AND HEAVY VEHICLES

- 27. No person shall drive, operate, pull or ride in any park
 - (a) any heavy machinery or equipment of any description and whatever the mode of power unless authorized by permit or with the authority of the Director; or
 - (b) any truck, trailer or bus whatsoever except a vehicle that is being used for the purpose of making a delivery to a point within the limits of the park while it is proceeding to or from such point of delivery.

SPEED

- 28. Unless authorized by permit, while in any park, no person shall operate
 - (a) any vehicle on a roadway at a speed in excess of the posted limit or 15 km/hr, whichever is greater;

(b) a bicycle, other than on a roadway, at a speed in excess of 20 km/hr.

PART VI - ANIMALS

DOGS, CATS AND DOMESTICATED WILDLIFE

- 29. While in any park, no person as owner or person having control of any dog, cat or domesticated wildlife shall
 - (a) allow it to run at large;
 - (b) permit any dog, cat or domesticated wildlife to enter any municipal beach/ waterfront area, swimming area, pond, garden, landscaped area or any other area posted to prohibit access, excluding a guide dog
- 30. Owners or persons having control of any dog, cat or domesticated wildlife shall
 - (a) ensure that it is on a leash or chain not exceeding 6 feet in length;
 - (b) pick up and remove forthwith excrement left by the dog, cat or domesticated wildlife and dispose of it in a receptacle for litter or in some other suitable container, excluding excrement from guide dogs.

DANGEROUS ANIMALS

31. No person being the owner or having control of any animal shall bring into or permit an animal to enter any park if it may or does constitute a danger to other park users, other animals, is unpredictable, or is reasonably likely to frighten other park users.

HORSES

- 32. Unless authorized by permit and able to provide proof of liability insurance, no person being the owner or having control of any horse, shall permit a horse to enter or remain in a park unless
 - (a) within a designated area for use by horses; and
 - (b) it is well broken and wearing a bridle.
- 33. Every owner, or person having control of any horse shall pick up and remove forthwith excrement left by the horse and dispose of it in a receptacle.

BIRDS

34. While in any waterfront/beach area or park no person shall feed birds.

PART VII - WATERCRAFT

BOATING/PERSONAL WATERCRAFT

35. No person shall, subject to any right at law to do so, place, operate, drive or ride any watercraft in any beach area or in any area posted so as to prohibit or restrict the type and allowable uses of watercraft unless authorized by way of a permit.

MOORING

- 36. Unless authorized by law, no person shall moor watercraft in any park or beach area
 - (a) except in a designated area;
 - (b) to dwell, lodge or camp except in a marina or yacht club authorized by Council or as otherwise posted;
 - (c) contrary to posted restriction or prohibitions or in any way that may or does endanger or inconvenience other watercraft or their use or other users of the park.

PART VIII - COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISES

SALE OF MERCHANDISE, TRADE OR BUSINESS DISPLAY

- 37. Unless authorized by permit, no person shall, while in any park, sell, offer or display for sale
 - (a) any food, ice cream products, drink or refreshments;
 - (b) any goods, wares, merchandise or articles including promotional material, souvenirs and novelties; or
 - (c) any art, skill, service or work
- 38. While in any park, no person shall practice, carry on, conduct or solicit for any trade, occupation, business or profession, unless authorized by permit.
- 39. Unless authorized by permit for exclusive park use for special events, no person shall subcontract the use of any park to a vendor.
- 40. All vendors holding regular permits require additional permission from event organizers with granted exclusivity.
- 41.. Every vendor promoting, displaying or selling goods, wares and merchandise shall comply with all applicable laws, including
 - (a) Public Health
 - (b) Building
 - (c) Fire
 - (c) Licensing
- 42. All vendors shall provide recycling service while in operation and shall deliver recyclables to the City's recycling centre.

CIRCULARS AND ADVERTISEMENTS

43. Unless authorized by permit, no person shall post, nail, attach, stencil or otherwise fasten or erect any poster, sign, notice, placard or other circular, bill, advertisement or paper to any park property.

PART IX - REGULATION AND ENFORCEMENT

SPECIAL EVENTS

- 44. For the purpose of special events where large crowds may be or are present, the Director may through the appropriate permits and authorizations, permit access and use of a designated area.
- 45. Any person requesting exclusive use of a park must apply to Council to obtain authorization for this use.
- 46. Temporary road closure shall be approved by Council by way of a resolution or can be co-ordinated with City Police on the event site if public safety is a factor.
- 47. For the purpose of special events where large crowds are present, event organizers have the authority by way of a permit, to prohibit access to animals (excluding guide dogs for disabled persons) if public safety is a concern in the opinion of the Director.
- 48. All vendors displaying or selling goods, wares or merchandise must meet the standards as defined by the appropriate governing agencies including, and not exclusive, to those referred to in Clause 41.
- 49. Violations of terms and conditions of this by-law or terms and conditions relating to permits or authorizations could result in the revocation of authority or termination of authority.

PERMITS AND LICENSES

- 50. The Director may issue permits for activities contemplated by this by-law, subject to such fees as set out in Schedule "C" to this by-law, or fees as approved by Council from time to time.
- The Director may issue permits for activities contemplated in this by-law with conditions as to time, location, area, equipment, number of participants, type of activities, release, indemnity and insurance coverage.
- 52. Violations of terms and conditions of this by-law or terms and conditions relating to permits or authorizations may result in the immediate revocation of authority or termination of authority without prior notice.
- 53. The issuance of a permit pursuant to this by-law shall not relieve any person from the necessity of acquiring any other license or permit required for such activities by any governmental or public authority.
- Any permit contemplated by this by-law shall be revoked if such permit results in a contravention of applicable law.

POSTING OF SIGNS

55. The Director is authorized to post signs of permission, regulation, restriction, warning or prohibition with respect to uses of or activities in any park in accordance with the provisions hereof.

TEMPORARY CLOSURES

56. The Director is authorized to close off for such temporary periods as the Director deems appropriate, any park or part thereof to relieve or prevent overcrowding or traffic congestion, or the interest of public safety.

EXCLUSIONS AND EXEMPTIONS

- 57. This by-law does not apply to
 - (a) the drivers, operators or other personnel of emergency service vehicles while engaged in the performance of their duties;
 - (b) employees or agents of the municipality while engaged in service on behalf of the municipality.
- 58. This by-law shall be subject to provisions of contracts and agreements now or hereafter entered into by the municipality covering works or services performed in any park.

ENFORCEMENT

- 59. Any police officer, provincial offences officer or employee of the municipality designated by the Director is encouraged to inform any person of the provisions of this by-law and to request compliance.
- 60. Any police officer, provincial offences officer or employee of the municipality whose duties include the enforcement of this by-law is authorized to request any person believed by such officer or employee to be contravening or who has contravened any provision of this by-law
 - (a) to desist from the activity constituting or contributing to such contravention;
 - (b) to remove from the park any animal, or thing owned by or in the control of such person which the officer or employee believes is or was involved in such contravention; or
 - (c) to leave the park.
- Where any person contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law or fails to comply with any order referred to in Clause No. 52 hereof, any permission or license of such person to remain in the park is revoked.

PART X - PENALTIES

- 62. Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law resulting from the operation of a motor vehicle is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to fine in such amount provided for by the Provincial Offences Act or the Highway Traffic Act.
- Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law where exclusive possession of the park is given by permit is subject to the Trepass to Property Act being enforced by the permittee.
- Any person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine or damages under the Provincial Offences Act.
- Any vendor who has a record of violations within city operated functions may be refused a permit for access to parks.

REMOVAL OF VEHICLE

A police officer or provincial offence officer upon discovery of any vehicle parked or standing in contravention of this by-law may cause it to be moved or taken to and placed in storage and all costs and charges for removing, care and storage thereof, if any, or a lien upon the vehicle which may be enforced in the manner provided by the Repair and Storage Liens Act or Mechanics/Garage Storage Liens Act, R.S.O. 1990,

as may be amended from time to time or any successor act thereto.

- 59. If a court should declare any part or section of a part of this by-law to be invalid, such part or section of a part shall not be construed as having persuaded or influenced Council to pass the remainder of the by-law and it is hereby declared that the remainder of the by-law shall be valid and shall remain in full force and effect.
- 60. By-law No. 106-81, as amended, is hereby repealed.
