

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY

BY-LAW NO. 56-82

BEING A BY-LAW TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN PRIVATE
PROPERTY AS MUNICIPAL HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS The Corporation of the City of North Bay has entered
into a Subdivision Agreement for which access to a King's
Highway is required;

AND WHEREAS Section 298 (1) (a) of the Municipal Act authorizes
the Council to establish and lay out highways;

AND WHEREAS the Municipality shall not open any highway or road
allowance entering upon or intersecting the King's Highway without
the consent of the Minister to the opening of the highway or road
allowance, which by-law does not take effect until the consent of
the Minister is endorsed thereon and the by-law is registered in
the proper Land Registry office.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH
BAY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. That the lands outlined in red on Schedule "A" attached
hereto and being Part of Lot 31 , Concession 11 in the
City of North Bay, be and the same are hereby established
and laid out as a public highway within the said City of
North Bay, which highway shall not be assumed for repair
or maintenance except in accordance with a certain sub-
division agreement between The Corporation of the City
of North Bay and Andre Bergeron.
2. This By-law can not come into force and effect until
such time as the Minister of Transportation and Communi-
cations of the Province of Ontario has consented to the
opening of the said lands as outlined in red on Schedule
"A" attached hereto, which will enter or touch upon or
give access to that part of the King's Highway known
as Highway No. 11.

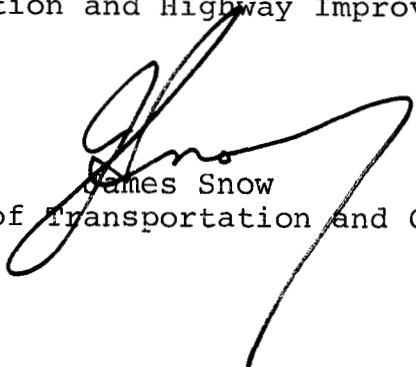
READ A SECOND TIME IN OPEN COUNCIL THE 13th DAY OF April , 1982.
