

BY-LAW NO. 1950

BEING A BY-LAW to declare Section 1 of The Lord's Day (Ontario) Act, 1950, to be in force in the City of North Bay.

WHEREAS a majority of the electors in the City of North Bay voting at the municipal elections held on the 12th day of December 1960, have voted in favour of public games and sports on the Lord's Day to be regulated by a municipal By-law under the authority of The Lord's Day (Ontario) Act 1950.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to make the provisions of the said statute applicable to the City of North Bay.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NORTH BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Section 1 of The Lord's Day (Ontario) Act, 1950, is hereby declared to be in force within the limits of the City of North Bay as same exist and as same may exist from time to time.
2. The application of the said section of the said Act in the City of North Bay shall be limited to the following public games and sports:-
  - (a) Baseball (hard and soft ball)
  - (b) Football (Rugby and Soccer)
  - (c) Ice Hockey
  - (d) Skating (Ice and Roller)
  - (e) Tennis
  - (f) Bowling (lawn and indoor)
  - (g) Squash
  - (h) Lacrosse
  - (i) Cricket
  - (j) Basketball
  - (k) Badminton
  - (l) Swimming
  - (m) Track and Field events
  - (n) Golf
  - (o) Boating (sail and motor)
  - (p) Skiing (winter and water)
  - (q) Shooting, target (indoor)
  - (r) Racing (auto, cycle and go-cart)
  - (s) Curling
3. The public games and sports named in this by-law shall be subject to the following regulations and controls:-
  - (a) Every such game or sport shall be conducted in a lawful and orderly manner, without undue discomfort, inconvenience or offence to non-participants.
  - (b) No such game or sport shall be commenced before one-thirty o'clock in the afternoon or be continued after six o'clock in the afternoon.
  - (c) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law is for each offence liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$300.00; such penalty to be recoverable under the provisions the The Summary Convictions Act.
4. This by-law shall take effect as of the day of its final passing.
